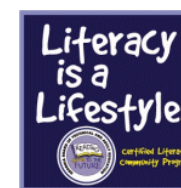

Increased literacy levels in the Chattahoochee Valley.

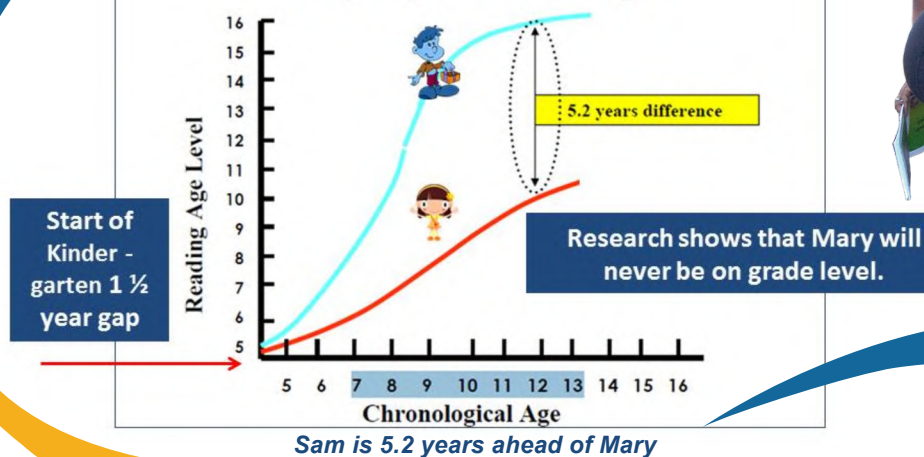
Mission

WHY INCREASING LITERACY IS SO IMPORTANT

- 43%** of adults with the lowest literacy levels live in poverty.
- 50%** of all children living in poverty begin school as much as 2 years behind their peers in preschool skills.
- 64%** of students who cannot read proficiently by the 4th grade will end up in jail or on welfare.
- 85%** of all juvenile offenders have reading problems.
- 71%** of Americans between 17 and 24 are ineligible to serve in the military due to lack of education, obesity/other physical problems, or criminal history
- 7,000** students in the USA drop out of high school everyday.

Our community is stronger and the economy is enhanced when families have access to resources and higher literacy levels. A strong literacy foundation leads to more educational and employment opportunities giving way to lower poverty and chronic unemployment.
